## Stud Book and Registration 2019 AQHA Convention Fort Worth, Texas

Mister President, the Stud Book and Registration Committee makes the following recommendations:

- 1. With respect to agenda items 13 and 14:
  - (13) Amend REG109 to include immune mediated myositis (IMM) as a genetic defect and undesirable trait and add a statement to registration certificates of foals descending from a horse who is a carrier that AQHA recommends testing to confirm presence or absence of the mutation.
  - (14) Add immune mediated myositis (IMM) to the genetic health panel.

the committee tabled the items and referred them to the genetic testing oversight council and requests that their recommendation be brought back to this committee at the 2020 AQHA Convention.

- With respect to agenda item 9, the committee denies the member's request to amend REG104.2 to allow horses to be eligible for advancement from the Appendix registry to the numbered registry if they earn a register of merit in youth or amateur classes. The committee also requests that the reason for denial be published.
- 3. With respect to agenda item 10, the committee denies the member's request to amend REG107 to prohibit the registration of horses beginning with foals born January 1, 2020, if they test positive for the identified genetic mutations.
- 4. With respect to agenda item 11, the committee denies the member's request to amend REG104.2 to allow a horse to advance from the Appendix registry to the Numbered registry if it is 80% or greater foundation quarter horse as determined by the National Foundation Quarter Horse Association or the Foundation Quarter Horse Association if it has not met performance requirements.
- 5. With respect to agenda item 12, the committee denies the member's request to amend REG127.2 to increase the age a horse is presumed deceased to 30 years of age.
- 6. In other business, the committee re-elected Jimmy Eller as chairman.

On behalf of the Stud Book and Registration Committee, I move that the Membership support these recommendations and forward them to the Board of Directors for approval.
